

JAMES MCALPINE AWARD

CONTRIBUTION TO THE REFRIGERATION AND AIR CONDITIONING INDUSTRY

PURPOSE

The James Stuart McAlpine Trust pays tribute to James Stuart McAlpine for his contribution to the refrigeration and air conditioning industry in New Zealand. He founded the firm McAlpine Refrigeration in 1934 and was chairman of directors until his death in 1961. It was largely through his past efforts that the industry progressed to where it is today. This Award was created in 1989 and first awarded in 1996.

The award takes the form of a plaque. Not necessarily awarded each year.

CATEGORY

- Nominated awards

CRITERIA

The IRHACE Council would evaluate each nomination received against the following criteria:

- The person nominated has not won the award previously.
- A financial member or branch of IRHACE has followed the nomination criteria.

Should there be more than one nomination received in a calendar year, the IRHACE Council may follow a process to determine a successful candidate. IRHACE does not have to advise their process to either the successful or unsuccessful candidates.

ELIGIBILITY

Nominees must meet the following eligibility:

- This award is open to anyone who is considered to have made a valuable contribution towards the betterment of the Refrigeration and Air Conditioning Industries.
- The award is not awarded twice to the same person.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations for the award can be made to the IRHACE Council by any financial member or affiliated branch of IRHACE enclosing both a history of the nominee and their association with the industry.
